The camp was established in 1936, and was the administrative centre/ training centre of all concentration camps. Sachsenhausen was not intended as an extermination camp – instead, the systematic murder was conducted in camps to the east. However, many died as a result of executions, casual brutality and the poor living conditions and treatment. Of the 200.000 people that passed through here 50% died. The camp was liberated by the Soviets in 1945 and used by them as “special camp No. 7 until 1950 where another 12.000 people perished. Places are limited so let the reception know if you are interested.
